HIGHLIGHTS OF MANUEL CASTELLS ACADEMIC CAREER

Manuel Castells, according to the Social Science Citation Index, is the most cited communication scholar in the world in the period 2000-2017, and the fifth most cited social scientist. According to the study published by Sociological Quarterly in 2020, he is among the top 6 sociologists most cited in the 2010s, including sociologists throughout history, such as Max Weber, Michel Foucault or Pierre Bourdieu. In terms of living sociologists he is second most cited, after Anthony Giddens, and ahead of Habermas.

He is the only scholar to have received the two most prestigious international awards in the social sciences and humanities: the Holberg Prize, from Norway, and the Balzan Prize from Switzerland/Italy.

He has been knighted by France, Chile, Catalonia, Portugal Finland, and Spain

His trilogy *"The Information Age: Economy, Society and Culture"* Blackwell (1996-2003),

translated in 22 languages, proposed the concept of the network society as a founding narrative of our contemporary world.

He founded and directed the Internet Interdisciplinary Institute, Open University of Catalonia, a major research organization with over 100 researchers and a doctoral program, in 2001-2012.

Has been a distinguished visiting professor at MIT, Oxford, Cambridge, and Tsinghua.

Has lectured in over 300 academic institutions in 45 countries.

Has received 23 honorary doctorates from around the world

He is a member of the Council of Scholars of the US Library of Congress

Has advised pro-bono the Secretary General of the United Nations, the President of the European Commission, and the Presidents of Brazil, Russia (Yeltsin), Spain, Finland, Portugal and Chile.

He was a founding Board Member of the European Research Council of the European Commission (the NSF of Europe, created in 2005), and a founding Board Member of the European Institute of Innovation and Technology of the European Commission.(created in 2008)
